INFANTS

Messes: bibs, blankets, high chairs, cushions, faces and hands, clothes, sheets

Priority Surfaces: floors, upholstery, pacifiers and other baby goods

TIP: While in use, always keep products securely closed and out of reach of children.

TODDLERS

Messes: hands, crayons/markers, foods

Priority Surfaces: tables, drawer handles, toys, cups/utensils, clothing

TIP: Keep cleaning products in their original packaging, and keep labels intact for safety information.

PRE-K

Messes: paint, juice, grass, dirt/mud, hands

Priority Surfaces: door knobs, computers/tablets, phones, toilets

TIP: Practice good hand hygiene with little ones who will soon be headed off to school.
